## **TRADITIONAL / MODERN**

### ***A Night to Remember: Haggadah of Contemporary Voices***

Mishael Zion and Noam Zion with illustrations by Michel Kichka

Full, traditional text interspersed with various reading sources, discussions, reflections, poems, art, stories, and activities to customize a Seder. Primarily in English with minimal Hebrew and little to no transliteration.

### ***Family Seder***

Rabbi Alfred J. Kolatch

A clear and complete service that is primarily in English with the significant parts also provided in Hebrew with transliteration.

### ***Concise Family Seder***

Rabbi Alfred J. Kolatch

An abridged version of the *Family Seder* that contains generous amounts of transliteration of the Hebrew texts.

Includes commentary from great Sephardic sages and Sephardic customs. Contains some text and songs in Ladino.

England's Chief Rabbi explores Passover and the Haggadah in a way that is both perceptive and challenging, and will add insight and nuance to understanding the meaning of Passover.

### ***The New American Haggadah***

Mordechai Kaplan, Eugene Kohn, and Ira Eisenstein; art by Leonard Weisgard

Sometimes known as the "Kaplan Haggadah," this version was first introduced in 1941 and is now updated for contemporary times. This traditional text is in Hebrew and English with some transliteration of the Hebrew provided.

Gender neutral and easy to follow for all ages. Includes songs and copious transliteration.

Karen Roekard, art by Nina Paley

A Haggadah for evolving consciousness. Psychological text is juxtaposed with lighthearted cartoon illustrations, with emphasis on thought, action, and the meaning of everyday constraints that keep us from being free. Key parts in Hebrew and transliteration.

The Workmen's Circle Department of Education & Culture with illustrations by Edyl Schaechter-Reznik

Stresses joy, memory, and unity through text and songs. In Yiddish with transliteration and English. Includes a pronunciation guide.
