

Daring to Resist: Jewish Defiance in the Holocaust

Exhibition contents:

Artifacts: Posters, correspondence, clothing, weaponry, religious objects, and photographs are among the many artifacts that illustrate the diverse forms of Jewish resistance.

Films: Eight films produced for the exhibition, incorporating survivor testimony and archival footage and photographs.

Exhibitory: All walls, casework, labels, text panels, graphics and audiovisual equipment needed by the host institution.

Additional materials: Electronic copy of Teacher's Guide, press materials (including high resolution images and the template of a news release), and final art for a variety of collateral materials.

Companion Volume: A 146 page soft-cover publication including more than thirty memoirs, oral histories and letters, complemented by original and thought-provoking essays. Fifty copies are provided free of charge.

Size: Approximately 2,000 square feet.

Security: Museum security required, including surveillance while open to the public.

Rental Fee/Booking Period: \$50,000 for a sixteen-week block, plus the costs of design reconfiguration (as needed), installation and de-installation. Borrower pays for roundtrip shipping of artifacts and exhibitory.

Insurance: Covered by the Museum of Jewish Heritage—A Living Memorial to the Holocaust.

Daring to Resist was awarded an Honorable Mention in the AAM Excellence in Exhibitions Competition in 2008.
