Fellowships at Auschwitz for the Study of Professional Ethics (FASPE) is now accepting applications for its 2016 law program. **FASPE Law** uses the conduct of lawyers and judges during the Holocaust and in Nazi Germany as a launching point for an intensive study of contemporary legal ethics. FASPE is predicated upon the power of place. Fellows visit Auschwitz and other sites in Germany and Poland where they consider how to apply the lessons of history as they confront the ethical challenges of law today.

Ten to 15 Fellows will be chosen for the 2016 program, which will run from **Friday, May 20 through Thursday, June 2**. All program costs, including travel to Europe from New York and back, European travel, lodging, and food are covered. FASPE Law is part of a program offering fellowships in several professional fields. Law Fellows travel and share some seminars with Journalism and Business Fellows.

FASPE Law is designed for students intending to become practicing attorneys, whether in **the private sector, with public interest organizations, or the government.**

FASPE programs are non-denominational. Candidates of all religious, ethnic, and cultural backgrounds are encouraged to apply.
