### **WELL-KNOWN FIGURES FROM THE PUNK SCENE LOOK AT THE NEW YORK JEWISH INFLUENCE ON PUNK**

*at the Museum of Jewish Heritage—A Living Memorial to the Holocaust*

NEW YORK, NY – Join us for a look at the fascinating New York Jewish origins of Punk as author **Steven Lee Beeber** and special guests **Susan Blond**, **Danny Fields**, **Lenny Kaye**, and **Mary Lucia** discuss *The Heebie-Jeebies at CBGB's* (Chicago Review Press, 2006) at the **Museum of Jewish Heritage—A Living Memorial to the Holocaust on Wednesday, December 6 at 7 p.m.**

Our panel of famous figures from the music scene will address Punk's ironic humor, leftist political engagement, and concern for the common man, among other topics. The Heebie-Jeebies of the title is more than just a joke then — it is an expression of the nervous “shpilke” ridden nature of Punk.

**Steven Lee Beeber** is a freelance journalist and writer. His articles and stories have appeared in *The Paris Review*, *The New York Times*, *Spin*, and elsewhere.

**Susan Blond** worked with Andy Warhol at *Interview* magazine, at CBS records where she guided the careers of bands such as The Clash, and was the first female vice president of a major record label.

**Danny Fields** is the former manager of The Ramones, The MC5, and Iggy Pop, and is a well known Punk personality.

**Lenny Kaye**, is the creator of the influential garage rock anthology “Nuggets,” and is a founding member of the Patti Smith Group.

**Mary Lucia** is a music host on Minnesota Public Radio's show *The Current*.
